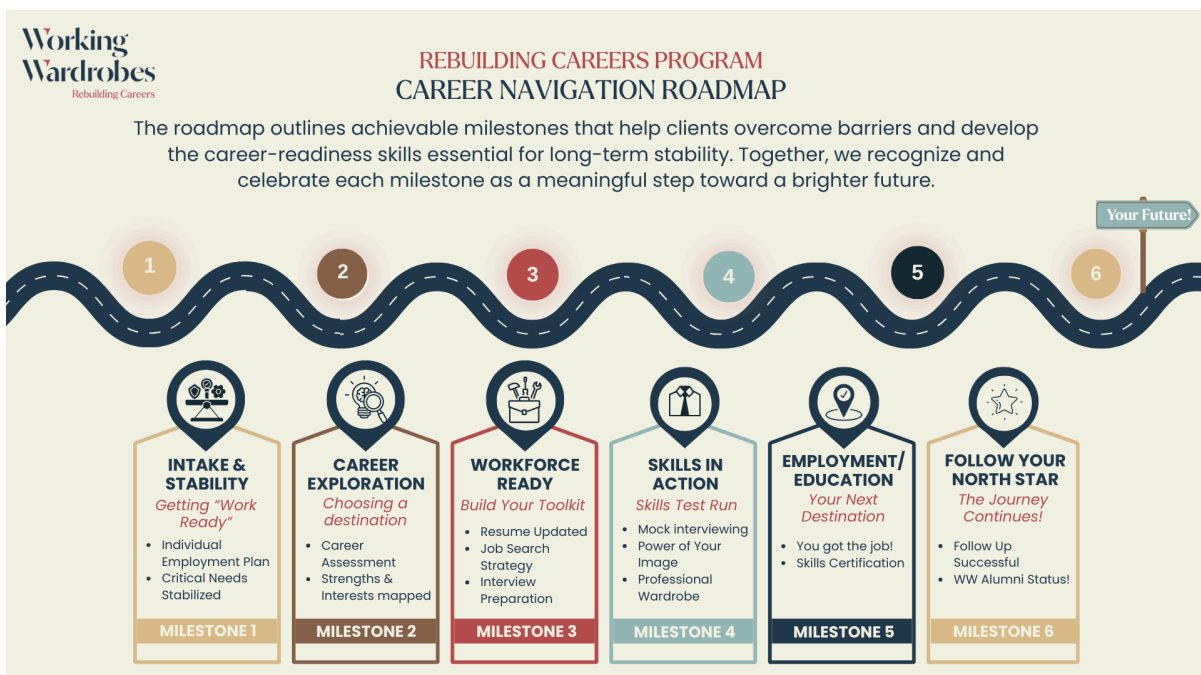
Personalized Support

Every person's Individualized Employment Plan is unique and may include career assessments, resume reviews, interview practice, job search training, workshops, certifications, supportive services, job placement support, and our signature service: personalized styling in a confidence-boosting outfit for the job interview.

Since 1990, Working Wardrobes has reached the lives of **over 140,000 individuals** on their employment journeys.

Career Navigators (experienced case managers) and **Career Coaches** (subject-matter experts in the Human Resources field) assist with job search skills, mock interviews, assessments, coaching, navigating hiring processes, strategizing job searches, creating LinkedIn profiles, and services like:

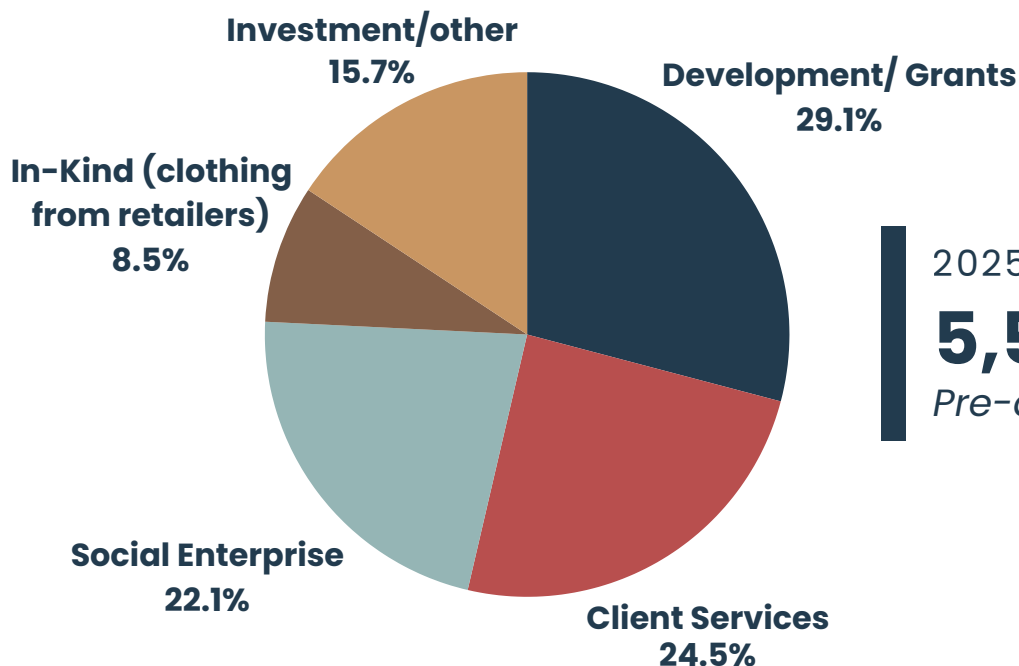

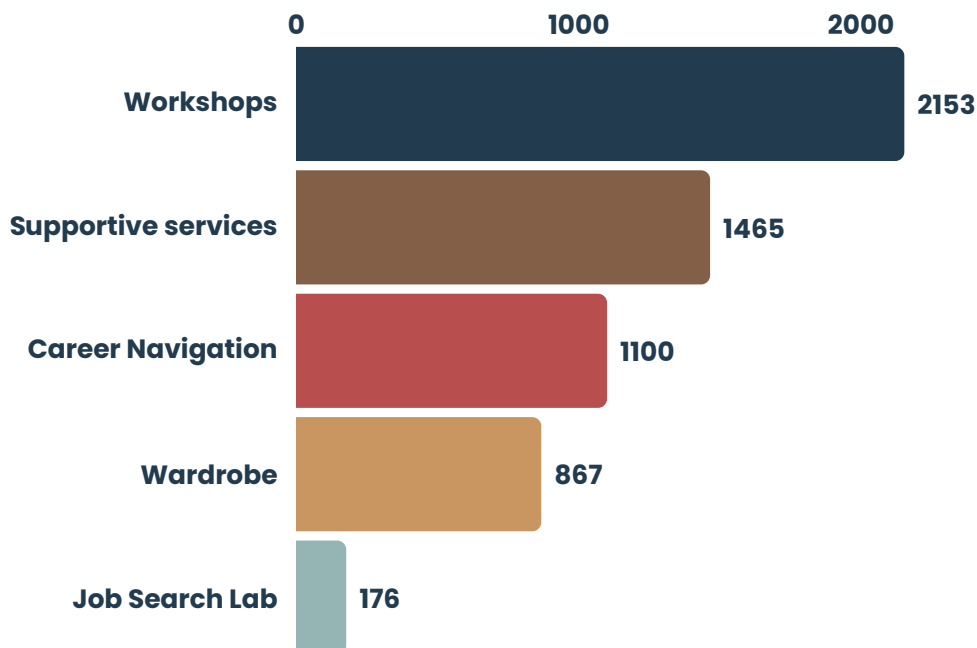


Haggar® This Good Feels Good™ Working Wardrobes

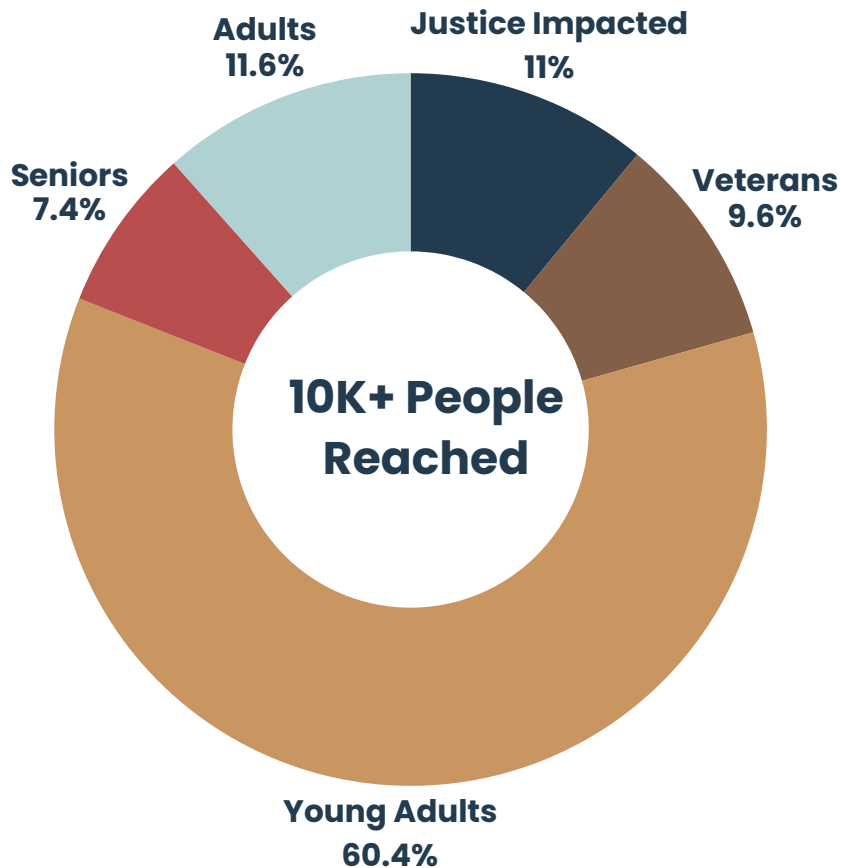
Mission in Action: Lynda

Community Partner Service Program

By collaborating with over 20 community partners, we enhance our impact through tailored career development programs. These programs, designed to meet specific client needs, include a mix of on-site and off-site workshops, along with individualized or small group wardrobe experiences.

Custom Workshops

Partners choose from our curated menu of topics – either as a full series or individual sessions. Each workshop includes an experienced facilitator and materials delivered onsite at their location.

Professional Wardrobe Services

Partners can engage Working Wardrobes for our signature experience. Participants can be scheduled as a group or referred individually for their wardrobe session, best when paired with The Power of Your Image workshop

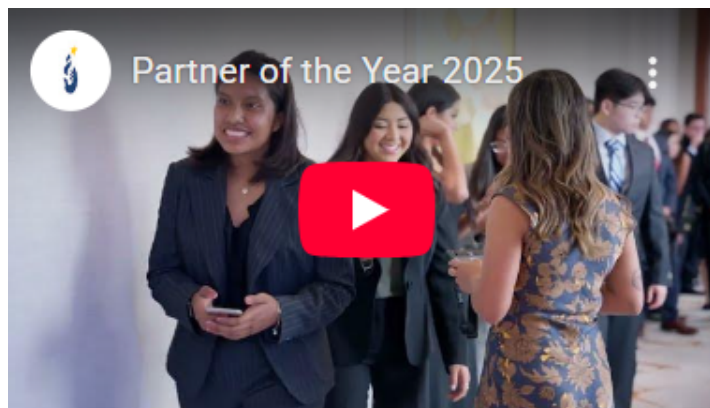
Community Partner Spotlight: Simon Scholars

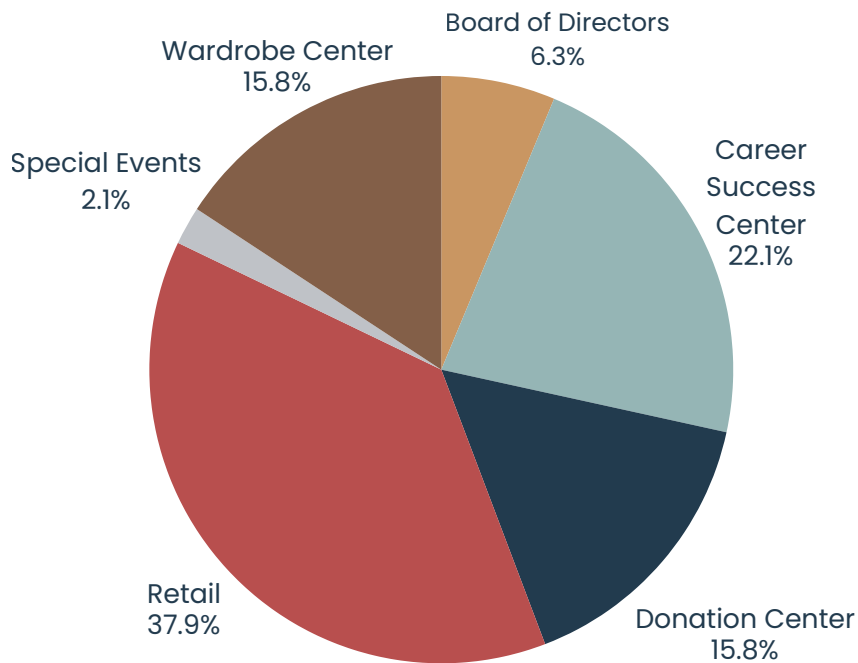

Volunteer Spotlight: Vira Career Coach



For more than 11 years, Vira Jo Denney has volunteered as a Career Coach at Working Wardrobes, helping clients identify their strengths, explore career paths, and approach their job search with confidence. *“Being able to help people and seeing the lightbulb come on when they realize they have a chance to land a job regardless of obstacles—that’s what keeps me coming back,”* she shared.

Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) Days

Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) Days **promote volunteerism** within corporate organizations and strengthen mission efforts by establishing partnerships in the community.

Over **10,000 clothing items** are processed monthly thanks to Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) days at the Donation Center.



What happens at a CSR?

- **Greet & accept items** from our generous donors.
- Perform **Quality Control** to curate clothing.
- **Sort and process** new clothing to dress clients for success.

How does it work?

- Groups consisting of 5 to 20 individuals.
- Three-hour shifts available (9 am–12 pm or 12–3 pm) on Wednesdays, Thursdays, or Saturdays.
- Tasks and projects tailored to align with your team's interests and skills.



CSR Spotlight: Boeing



In September, Boeing volunteers rolled up their sleeves at our Donation Center—sorting, tagging, and processing hundreds of clothing donations that help clients show up with confidence for interviews and their first days on the job. Many items support our Wardrobing Center, while others stock The Hanger retail stores, where 100% of proceeds fuel our mission.

Boeing deepened their impact with a \$75,000 grant, strengthening career coaching, workshops, and wardrobing services for job seekers on the path to meaningful employment.

Power Up For Success

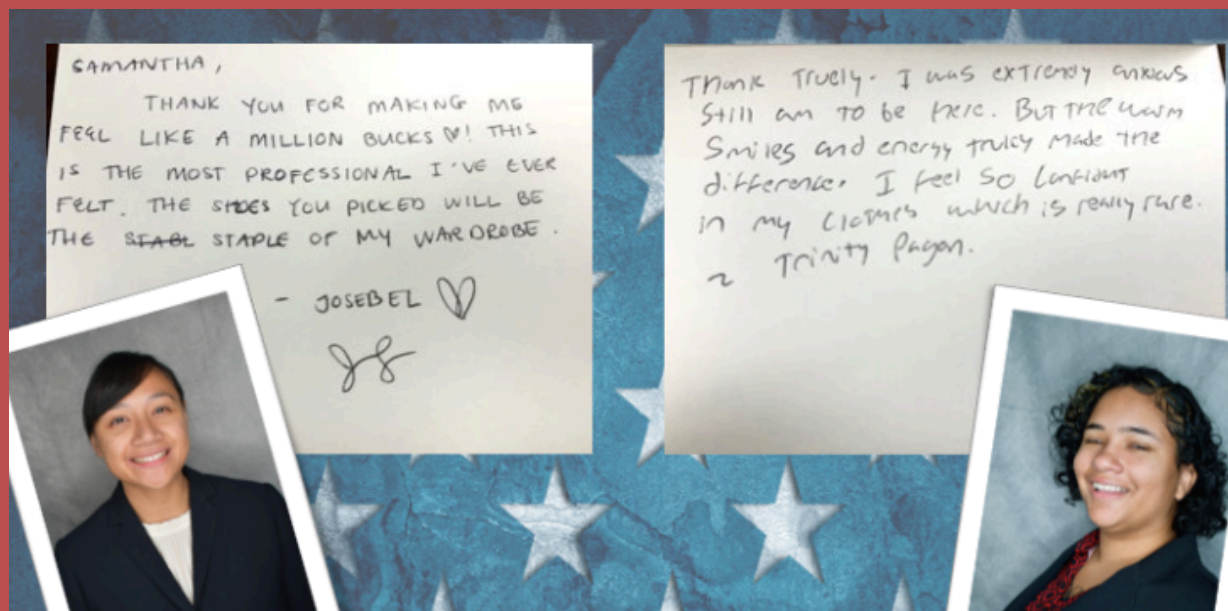
Power Up For Success is a signature event that delivers multiple career-readiness services and support in one day. Helping people feel confident, prepared, and interview-ready as they pursue meaningful employment.



100 participants received interview-ready outfits, professional headshots, and personal branding guidance—helping lead to **45** conditional job offers.

On May 20 at Camp Pendleton's MilSpouse Career and Hiring Symposium, Working Wardrobes partnered with the Family Member Employment Assistance Program to support military spouses through our Power Up for Success initiative, providing professional wardrobe services and career readiness workshops for transitioning service members and their spouses.

Rebuilding Careers Coalition (RCC)

The **Rebuilding Careers Coalition (RCC)** is a giving collective of individuals and corporations dedicated to empowering people in our community. Through monthly and annual donations, the Coalition helps jobseekers overcome barriers to employment.

RCC members raised over **\$50,000** to fund wrap-around workforce readiness services for **25 clients**.

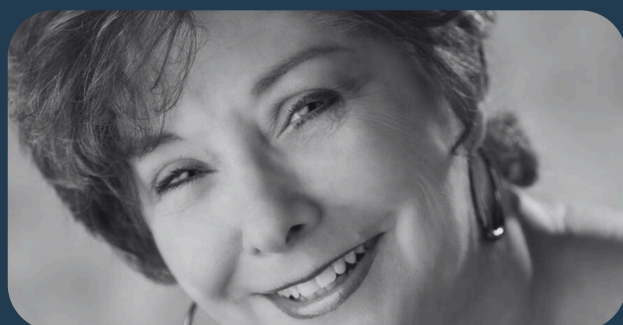

Working Wardrobes Donation Center

Over **550,000** new and gently used clothing and accessories were donated and given a second life in 2025.

We pride ourselves on being good stewards of our community and the environment through upcycling, re-donating, and recycling efforts.

Upcycle - After undergoing a comprehensive quality-control check, business clothing, shoes, and accessories are provided to the Wardrobe Center to outfit clients in their perfect Success Suit. Clothing is also sent to The Hanger retail store locations where shoppers can purchase these gently-loved garments to provide them with a new life and help fund the mission.

Re-donate - Due to the generosity of our amazing apparel donors, we supply other local nonprofits with excess merchandise.

Recycle - Clothing that is too damaged to wear is provided to a textile recycler. Nothing goes to waste or landfills.

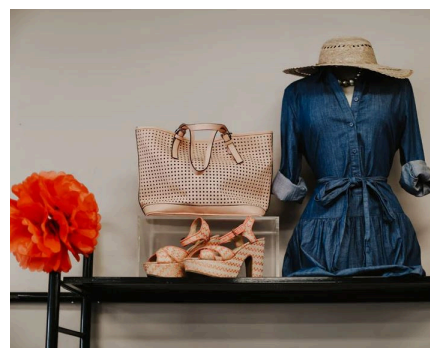
