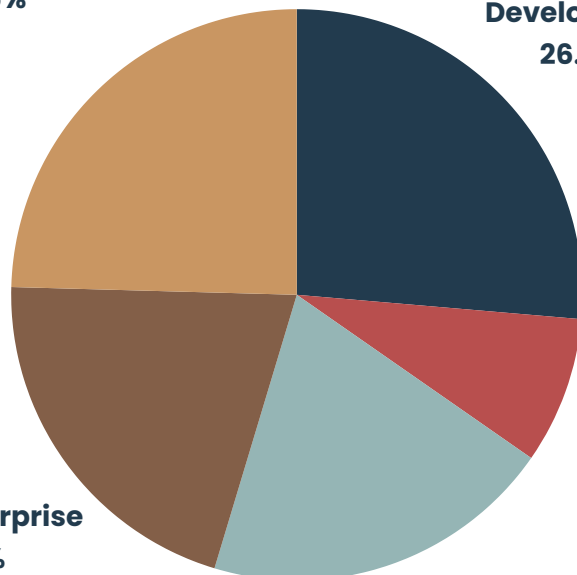

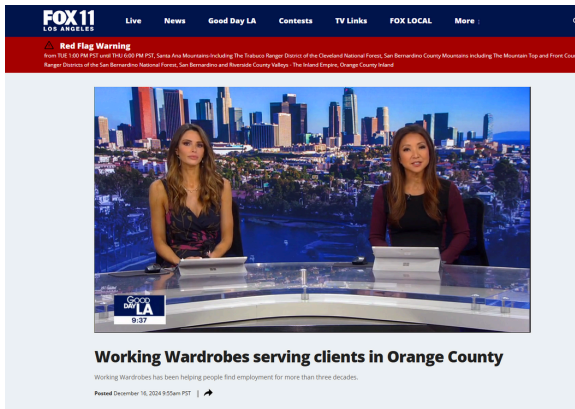

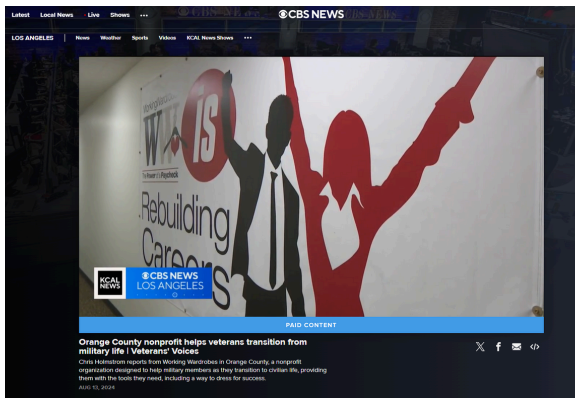

Rebuilding Careers Program

We envision a future where every person transforms their potential into purpose, to create lives of lasting fulfillment and ultimately a stronger community. Working Wardrobes' full-service **Rebuilding Careers Program** provides services to people facing self-described barriers to gainful employment, **at no cost to them**. We help people develop workforce readiness skills through **individualized employment plans**.

Personalized Support

We utilize trained case managers as Career Navigators and experts in the Human Resources field who volunteer as Career Coaches to assist with workforce readiness skills including:

- Career goal setting and Individualized Employment Plans
- Career Assessments
- Life skills training
- Resume building & Job search strategies
- Interview preparation and practice sessions
- Secondary Education and Skill-based certification programs

Career Development Training Programs

We offer a diverse range of workforce readiness trainings to clients in formats that best serve a variety of learning styles. We have over 12 different internally designed workshops presented in small group settings both in-person and virtually by trained Facilitators. These workshops are designed to provide hands-on skill building opportunities on traditional workforce readiness topics but also include topics like:

- Power of Your Image - Professional branding
- Navigating Success in the Workplace
- Transitioning MOS (military occupational specialty) into Civilian Life
- Networking & Informational Interviewing

We also partner with volunteers who offer their expertise to provide trainings on topics like financial literacy, mental health, industry trends and shared life experiences.

Additionally, with the support of our partners, clients can access free self-paced virtual learning programs to be completed at their own pace



Rebuilding Careers Program (cont.)

Community Partner Service Program

By collaborating with community partners and leveraging our expertise, we create a greater impact in the community. Currently, we work with over 20 partners who have tapped into our workforce readiness expertise, selecting tailored career development programs to meet the specific needs of their clients. These programs may include a mix of on-site and off-site workshops, as well as individualized or small group wardrobe experiences. We enhance the invaluable work our partners are already doing by offering our signature workforce readiness services.

Success Suits You

Our signature professional wardrobe service takes place in a department store like setting with the support of Personal Stylists that help clients select an outfit that empowers them to take on that interview with confidence! Actively engaged full-service clients are eligible for one complimentary outfit while community partners can select from different wardrobe packages that best suit their clients' needs.



Mission in Action: Emmanuel

Determined to build a better future, Emmanuel turned to Working Wardrobes for support. With resume help, interview preparation, certifications, transportation resources, and an interview suit to boost his confidence.

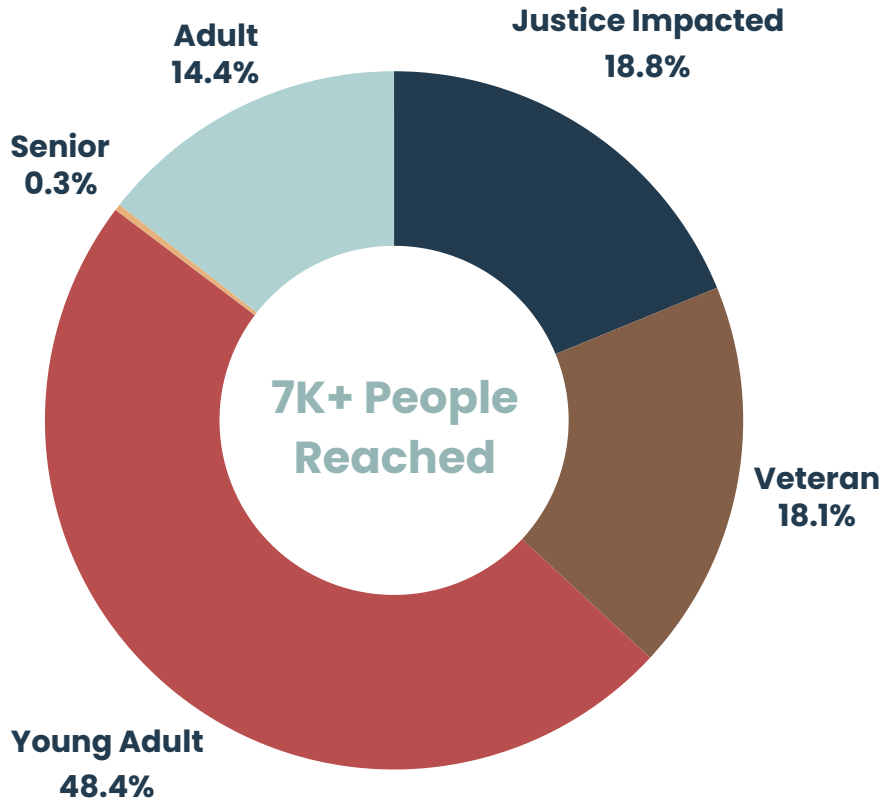

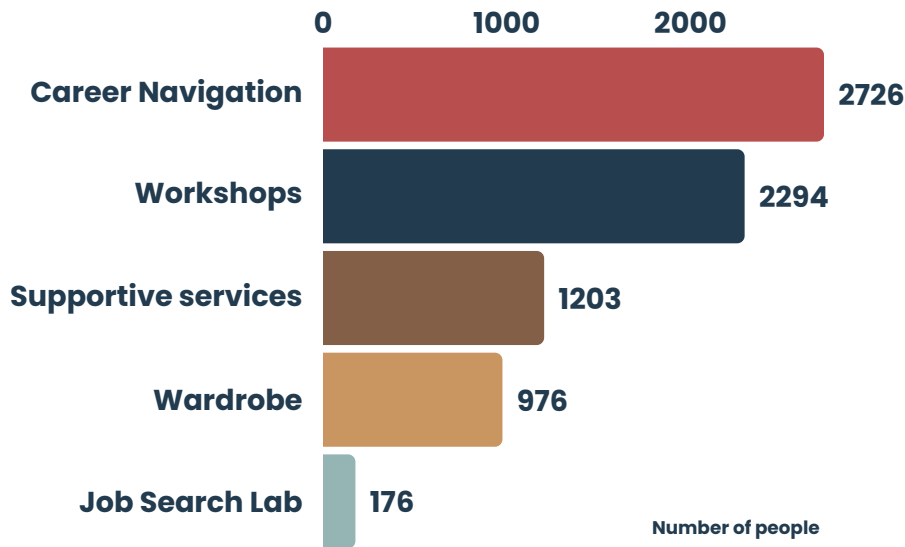
Populations Reached

We expanded our reach into the community and surpassed our pre-pandemic outreach and service numbers. In 2024 we transcended our goal of reaching 6000 people and reached **7615** people on their employment journeys.



Services Provided

Individuals enrolled in our workforce readiness program, Rebuilding Careers, on average, received **5 services each!**



We launched **Project New Start**

In partnership with the City of Santa Ana, we provided a deeper level of support to individuals involved with the justice system. Program participants engaged in skills-based **training and certification programs**, secondary education enrollments, an 8-part workforce readiness **soft skills** workshop series, and a **professional wardrobe** package.

111 clients enrolled

16 enrolled in training, pursued post-secondary education, or earned a certification

32 are already employed!

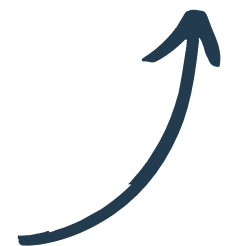
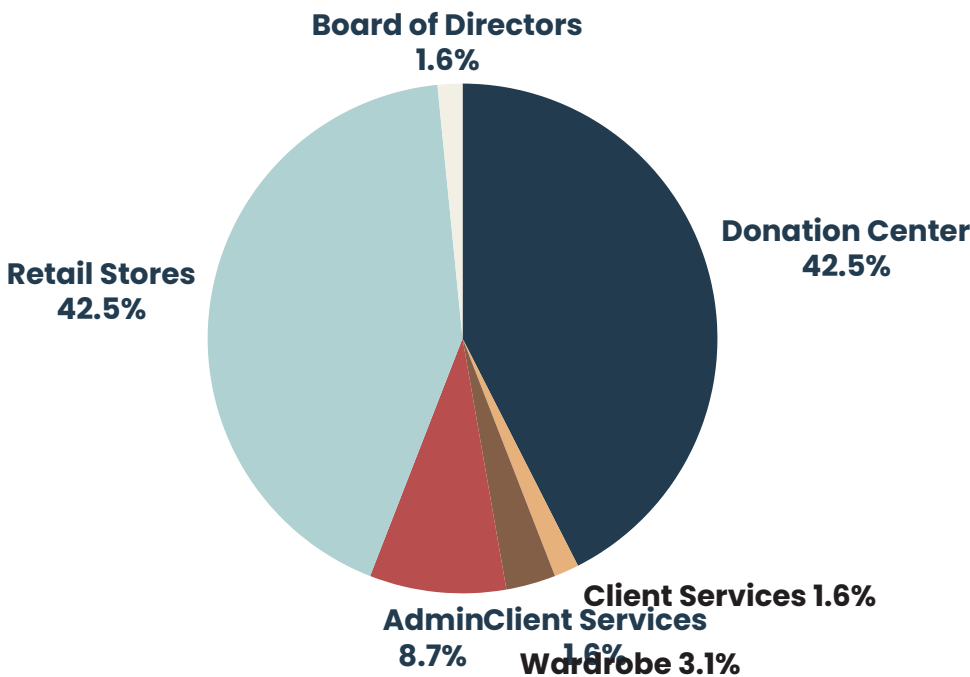

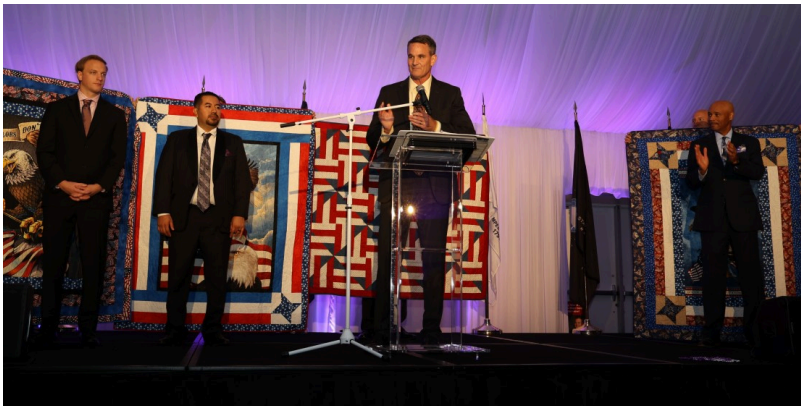

Power Up For Success is a signature event providing a variety of **career preparedness services** to active duty **Marines/Sailors** preparing to transition out of the military.

Over **\$110,000** was donated to support their upcoming transitions into the civilian workforce. **139 clients** were provided with full wrap-around workforce readiness services at these events.



Attendees learned about successful transitions into the workforce from a distinguished panel of Veterans, discovered potential careers that utilize their military skills and experiences, networked at an onsite job fair, and received a professional wardrobe and headshot – all culminating in a celebratory fashion show.

Mission in Action: Marines Give Thanks



Working Wardrobes Donation Center

Over **500,000** new and gently used clothing and accessories were donated and given a second life in 2024.

We pride ourselves on being good stewards of our community and the environment through upcycling, re-donating, and recycling efforts.

Upcycle - After undergoing a comprehensive quality-control check, business clothing, shoes, and accessories are provided to the Wardrobe Center to outfit clients in their perfect Success Suit. Clothing is also sent to The Hanger retail store locations where shoppers can purchase these gently-loved garments to provide them with a new life and help fund the mission.

Re-donate - Due to the generosity of our amazing donors, we can support other local nonprofits with excess merchandise.

Recycle - Clothing that is too damaged to wear is provided to a textile recycler. Nothing goes to waste/landfills.
